

#### **Investment Committee**

Our first full year of "total return investing" has helped the church's invested funds surge ahead. Total return investing is based on investing for growth and income to protect the value from the effects of inflation and to help grow the principal. In prior years the church's funds had largely been invested for income driven by the demand for income to support church operations. This strategy produced more income than we are currently generating, but it provided no growth or protection from inflation. The new approach takes a portion of the average growth over time and income to a percentage of the total. During 2019, the committee set a withdrawal rate of about 4.5%.

The endowment fund has grown 19% this year. \$30,000 was withdrawn to support the operating fund. The SJ Johnson fund grew 20% and contributed \$4,000 to the operating fund.

The investment committee has approved a withdrawal percentage for 2020 of 4.5%.

February 25, 2020 Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner

Shrove Tuesday is the day before Lent starts on Ash Wednesday. The name Shrove comes from the old middle English word 'Shriven' meaning to go to confession to say sorry for the wrong things you've done. Lent always starts on a Wednesday, so people went to confessions on the day before. This became known as *Shriven Tuesday* and then *Shrove Tuesday*.

The other name for this day, Pancake Day, comes from the old English custom of using up all the fattening ingredients in the house before Lent, so that people were ready to fast during Lent. The fattening ingredients that most people had in their houses in those days were eggs and milk. A very simple recipe to use up these ingredients was to combine them with some flour and make pancakes!
