Pastor's Page

The calendar always moves us rapidly this time of the year. Thanksgiving immediately gives way to Advent, the beginning of the Christian year, and then rolls on toward the Christmas pageant, Christmas music, and all the traditional events we cherish. They seem all the more important this during the Covid lock-downs and mounting stress for so many.

Pastors usually remind the congregation that Advent is a season of reflection and preparation. True, but it is with some trepidation that I mention these themes this year. I can just hear members saying, "I've been reflecting ever since early March when the pandemic hit and forced me to stay home, forced me to curtail radically my social outings including going to church and church events like coffee hour. I never knew I would miss coffee hour so much!"

We will, nevertheless, prepare ourselves for the coming of the Prince of Peace. We need prayer like never before as we pray for peace in a troubled world, a deeply divided nation, and within our families and local communities, plus our individual spiritual lives. I have often found that a prayer from a different culture enables me to think about a traditional theme in a new way. Recently, I ran across the following prayer by Wanda Lawrence of the Chippewa community of the Great Lakes region. As you may know, an eagle in Native American tradition is often a carrier of prayer:

"We pray that someday an arrow will be broken, not in something or someone, but by each of humankind, to indicate peace, not violence.

Someday, oneness with creation, rather than domination over creation, will be the goal to be respected.

Someday fearlessness to love and make a difference will be experienced by all people.

Then the eagle will carry our prayer for peace and love, and the people of the red, white, yellow, brown and black communities can sit in the same circle together to communicate in love and experience the presence of the Great Mystery in their midst.

Someday can be today for you and me. Amen"

May your December be filled with eagles!

We all need help to feel fine ..."

Don't give in to the darkness, don't hide your light. Embrace each new day as chance to shine in the love of God. Face the changes and the challenges knowing that whoever believes in the Light of the World will never walk in darkness.



Our church once again responded in an amazing way to a need from the New Milford Food Bank. The church set a goal to see if we could collect 100 cans/jars of gravy in less than a week for the Thanksgiving food distribution. The result? We collected 120 cans/jars and 30 other items for donation.

We closed out a successful year with our shared garden. We plan to improve three plots in the spring by boxing them in. We also plan to dedicate more space to fewer items, since the culinary school used some vegetables more than others and we want the garden to be as productive and effective as possible. We are also looking at options to improve the irrigation of some of the high water using crops.


Investment Committee

Values for the investment accounts were down over 3% at the end of October compared to September month end, reflecting the volatility of the stock market as the election neared and the pandemic surged. However, in the first part of November the values of these accounts have improved and now are at their highest point since last January. Uncertainty about the economy because of COVID-19 is likely to create swings in the stock market in coming months. The church is invested in funds which have been less volatile than the stock market at large.

Called to Care Ministry

This program is our way of extending Christ's helping hand within our own congregation. We recognize that members come to our church family with diverse needs and talents. Called to Care is devised to match those two elements that we might first meet the needs of our own congregation, thereby equipping ourselves to go into the world as disciples of Jesus Christ. There is a need for:

- **Parish Friends** congregants develop ongoing relationships with the other members through regular visits, over the phone or in person.
- **Parish Drivers** serve the congregation by volunteering to drive those who cannot to church and, in rare cases, to the other crucial appointments.
- **Meal Chain** church members make and deliver meals to those who have suffered a loss, welcomed a new child, or are in times of transition.
- **Prayer Ministry** a prayer chain set up to offer prayers on behalf of congregation members and others in times of illness, difficulty, or joy.
- **Condolence Reception** volunteers bake cookies, make finger sandwiches, and host receptions at funerals and memorial services.

This year I am calling on all my youth readers to help read the traditional nativity story in chunks. You will record your portion at home and send it to me. Then it will be digitally strung together and presented on December 20th (traditional Pageant Sunday) during the regular worship service!

Not interested in reading but still want to participate? You and your child can arrange stop by to grab a costume and have me video you wearing it to be included in the Pageant video. (We have enough costumes that no one will have to share anything) OR you can grab your favorite stuffed animal or live pet and record yourself as a shepherd, make a crown or halo and become a king or angel, you get where I'm going with this. What we need is for as many of you to participate as possible to make this successful and lift the Christmas spirit of not only our congregation but of everyone who accesses our website. Will you help?

Please let Becky Passero know by December 1st if your child would like to be a reader. She will send your child the part to read. ALL recordings and pictures are due to Becky at cedirector@nmchurch.org by Sunday, December 6th 12noon.

Recording recommendations:

- 1.) Need is to be able to see space around the sides and above their bodies from the waist up.
- 2.) Give a 5 sec start and ending before and after talking for editing purposes later. Remember to smile and speak slowly!
- 3.) Please rest your camera on a solid surface to reduce movement as much as possible.
- 4.) Before recording, the person recording, should check for uneven lighting (ex. shadows laying across the child's face/body, bright light on one side of the child, etc), noises
- 5.) Try not to be holding up the paper in front of their face.



Advent Lessons and Crafts Bags



Advent is here! We have something special in store for this Advent season. We will be switching from virtual Sunday School lessons to Livestreaming stories and crafts each Sunday of Advent (November 29, December 6, 13, and 20) at 11am.
