Pastor's Page

During the month of March we will continue our spiritual journey through Lent, exploring the meaning of discipleship through Sunday worship services, daily devotions, and prayers. Near the end of the month we will ponder anew the familiar stories of Holy Week and the passion of Christ.

In 2021, the first Passover Seder will be on Saturday, March 27th, beginning at sundown. It will end at sunset on Saturday, April 3rd for Reform and progressive Jews and on April 4th for Orthodox and Hasidic Jews. In the Gospel of John we read: "Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him." (John 12: 1-2)

John continues to describe the scene by saying that Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus, took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard and anointed Jesus' feet and then wiped them with her hair. We receive this powerful story in the context of Jesus' coming passion. The dynamic of discipleship here clearly indicates the love and appreciation Jesus has for his friend Martha. It also captures her deep devotion to him in the act of anointing. We should not be surprised; after all, she witnessed him raising her brother from the dead. It seems as though she spontaneously, intuitively, and extravagantly models genuine discipleship. May she motivate us today while we continue to minister to one another as we enter year two of the global COVID pandemic.

As is true of many dinner gatherings, someone had a different opinion and did not hesitate to express it. John reports that Judas Iscariot asked: "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" John immediately inserts his commentary: "He said this not because he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it." Actually, this is another type of discipleship. We sense counterfeit compassion by one who is clearly perturbed by Mary's after dinner display of adoration. Greed rules Judas' heart and is not concealed by his pious chatter. In sharp contrast to Martha, he is the unfaithful disciple.

May we check our motivations during March, and may we review our actions or lack thereof during Lent. John 12:1-8 grants us permission to offer our own extravagant gifts of love, devotion, and acts of care and thoughtfulness to those whom we encounter, be they near or far.

The parsonage sale has been finalized, providing us with a boost to our bank account, as well as savings going forward in our utility and insurance bills.





Baby Bundles




