

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death = TESTING


I will fear no evil = PROTECTION



Social Concerns and Missions Committee

Loaves and Fishes has asked us to consider using our kitchen for the balance of the year, while they have some work done at the Richmond Center. The Social Concerns and Missions team believes this is a great opportunity. The Loaves and Fishes team has examined our space, and are in the process of reviewing if it would work for them operationally.

- o This would be a 7 day a week operation
- o There would be 3-4 volunteers each afternoon preparing and distributing meals
- There would be some storage requirements in Fellowship Hall, but there would not be any issue with having Sunday Fellowship, if we decide to resume live fellowship after services.

This was discussed, voted on, and approved at the March Church Night Meeting, Right now the estimate is that church operating costs will increase about \$10-\$15 per day to have the kitchen open each day. The Social Concerns and Missions team believes that we can raise the funds from our congregation, our out of town former members, and the community to cover any incremental costs associated with this work.




Investment Committee
