#### **Meet Our New Pastor!**



**Reverend Amy Carter** was ordained by the Rhode Island Conference of the United Church of Christ (RICUCC) in 2012, and served Hope Congregational Church UCC, a multi-racial, multicultural congregation, as its settled pastor for nearly nine years. As part of that role, she founded a non-profit day care and oversaw its startup year, in which the skills from running a small side business were invaluable. She is a 2010 graduate of Andover Newton Theological School, and from 2008-2012 served as intentional interim minister at United Congregational Church of Westerly in Pawcatuck, CT. In addition, Rev. Amy has also served as the administrator of the RICUCC and as a bridge interim. Her undergraduate degree was completed at the University of Rhode Island where she studied Human Development and Family Studies with a concentration in gerontology. Her professional passions include healthy congregational dynamics, sustainable ministry, and economic justice.

On a personal note, she is a native Rhode Islander who had been living in eastern Connecticut, but recently relocated to New Milford. Her three children have been successfully launched into the world, and all live out of state. Rev. Amy enjoys outdoor activities such as kayaking and mountain biking; Indoors she likes to read, quilt, knit, embroider, and cook. She describes herself as an extrovert with a love of people, a healthy sense of humor, and a deep and abiding sense of gratitude for what God has done in her life.


We had a very successful Mother's Day Blanket program this year, raising \$420 for Church World Service Blankets!

#### **Buildings and Grounds**

I have great news to report: our elevator is working again! Jeff Vill and a good friend of his made the necessary repairs and we now have a fully functional way for members and guests to get to Fellowship Hall when they find it difficult or impossible to use the stairway.

The elevator, or correctly called a lift, had become a maintenance nightmare because we were told that original replacement parts were no longer available. After numerous service calls, and the mounting expense, we elected to lock the access doors and take it out of service.

The Meetinghouse Restoration Committee began looking into alternative ways to either rehabilitate the lift or install a new one as part of Phase 2 (where Phase 1 was repairing the broken roof truss). Jeff researched for any company capable and willing to repair the lift, but was unsuccessful, so he decided to tackle the job himself with additional expert help.

Since the lift had been out of service for quite a long time our insurance carrier required that we have it inspected before placing it back in service. I'm pleased to report that on the Town of New Milford Building Department made the inspection and provided a document that it's in good working condition.

Installing a new lift would have exceeded what funds remained after the roof was repaired. A new lift would have cost an estimated \$40,000 and a quote for installing a bathroom near the Sanctuary and on the main floor was \$36,000. Thank you very much, Jeff!

The next project will be installing motorized assistance for the Fellowship Hall bathroom doors to make them easier to access for people using walkers and wheelchairs.

The church's invested funds have been doing well as the stock market has improved since the low point in March 2020. At April month-end, the endowment, SJ Johnson, and Scholarship funds were up 7% since the beginning of 2021. The investment and maintenance funds are up about 3%. These funds only recently had money for long-term investment and were only invested for long term growth after the start of the year.
