

#### **Music Team:**

The Music Team has met several times to discuss performances during the continuing pandemic. As recommended by Sarah Fay, the Senior Choir is rehearsing Thursday nights for 45 minutes. #### FCC of New Milford - Emergency Cancellation Process

People involved: Pastor, Building & Grounds, Worship Ministry Chair, Christian Education Ministry Chair, Communications Team, Staff

- 1. If the Governor declares a state of emergency, church will be cancelled.
- 2. If the weather is bad but no emergency is declared, Building & Grounds will determine road conditions and reach out the Pastor by 7:30am. The Pastor and Worship Ministry Chair will make the call to have church or not. The pastor will send an email to the group above and Ministry Chairs will contact their teams.
- 3. If the church will be open and the pastor cannot get here, then the Deacons will lead the service.
- 4. Worship Ministry Chair, Christian Education Ministry Chair, and staff will make the decisions for the Sunday School and music and will contact people directly, informing the rest of the group.
- 5. Worship Ministry Chair will email TeamMembers@nmchurch.org.
- 6. The Communications Team will notify TV channels, post on Facebook, post on the website, and send out Constant Contact.
- 7. Building & Grounds will post signs on the church's doors.
- 8. Office Staff will contact the cleaning service.

#### Men's Breakfast



#### The Importance of Fellowship

#### **Outreach Ministry**

Each of the teams is continuing to update their calendar of events/programs for the balance of 2021 and the beginning of 2022.

- The key activity for Social Concerns in September was working to help host the September 19<sup>th</sup> Walk a Mile for a Meal event. This was a good event that not only brought blessings to the community, but also showcased our church. We had volunteer bakers that provided an abundance of cookies and brownies for the walkers, a large amount of church members walking, and a great bunch of members hosting the tables of snacks/baked goods and water/lemonade. The New Milford Social Services team was very appreciative, and complimented us on how well our church supports this event. The net result from this event is that the Food Bank now has 30 days of food for families in need.
- Baby Bundles is working on ideas to better serve families as the COVID restrictions change, including efficient ways of providing baby needs given the alternative options that have emerged in New Milford
- The Scholarship Committee is looking at options since Village Fair Days is cancelled, and the tag sale is not planned. They would be interested in working with other groups for fundraising events.


