

Minister's Message

1 Peter 4:9 – "Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling."

In April when I candidated to be the settled pastor, I had a glimpse of the wonderful things that awaited me in the church and in New Milford. I relocated just a few hours from my long-time home, but far enough that nothing was familiar. I knew I was in for an adventure, and came fearlessly knowing that the good people of the church would help me settle in this new place.



Open and Affirming (aka ONA) is a specific designation of the United Church of Christ. After years of talking about this process, our ONA team is poised to begin the journey to help the congregation determine if FCC will become an Open and Affirming church. Most churches display signs that proclaim "All are Welcome." However, in many cases that means, 'we welcome all people who are like us,' or in some cases people who are different will be tolerated, but not fully accepted into the life of the church. Open and Affirming in the UCC means that we not only welcome, we fully affirm that all people are children of God - that means 'all.' This includes, but is not limited to, 'people like us,' people of all races and ethnic backgrounds, people with varying abilities, people from every socio-economic level, and specifically people in the LGBTQ community. Open and Affirming allows people to know that this church is a safe place where they will be welcomed and affirmed for who God created them to be. This is an exciting step forward! This process will take some time and we need your input. Going forward there will be opportunities for listening sessions, study groups, and more information. Men's Breakfast

Please note: This month, we will continue our testing work and discussion of results regarding the efficacy and effectiveness of bacon versus sausage on perceived happiness. This is important work, so please join us!

Room Rentals

As fall approaches, we are back having to implement restrictions with building usage. The CDC has recommended masks be worn by everyone indoors regardless of their vaccination status. In spite of this, the buildings are still open for groups to use, and our past groups are coming back.

Rental revenue is expected to decrease in 2022 with the library being finished and their no longer requiring our space. They were originally expected to only need our space until the summer of 2021, but the current estimate is they will be a tenant until January 2022. Our other renters are expected to continue using our space, and we are working on attracting new clients. The realtor we used in the past will be listing our property in the near future.

The Boy and Girl Scouts will be coming back to the Parish House this fall. We are adding a Boy Scout troop to the one we already have using our building, and one of the Girl Scout troops has disbanded. We get requests for various events, such as baby showers, parties for baptisms, birthday parties, etc., and we continue to promote our space wherever possible.

With Pastor Amy now with us, and the roof fixed, we are looking forward to hosting more weddings. If you know of anyone looking for space to host an event, please have them contact me to discuss options.

Christian Education Ministry

Church School begins again, in person, on Sunday, September 12, 2021. That Sunday, Bibles will be dedicated and given to our third graders. We will also dedicate those who have volunteered to teach this Church School year: Carol and Katie McKay, Peggy King, Erin Haynes, Mike Curley, and Dave Eherts. Registration letters have been sent in the mail. If you did not get one, please use the OR Code in the CE newsletter to register your child(ren) for Church School.

The Pre-K (age 3) - 6th grades will continue to meet in the Parish House classrooms from approximately 10:20am to 11:15am. We are introducing a new curriculum that will align with the liturgy in church: Deep B.L.U.E One Room Schoolhouse. This includes children's bulletins, ages appropriate songs based on the Psalms, crafts, games, and Bible stories. This is an inclusive classroom where children are fully immersed in the Bible, learning that they are loved and a child of God.

Our 7th – 12th grades are flipped. First, they meet downtown at a local eatery (place TBD) from 9am- 9:45am for food and fellowship then return to the church, meeting in the Chapel until approximately 10:20am. This is their class time which focuses on the morning scriptures. They join the service in time to hear the sermon, which ties what they've just heard in class together.

Youth group is open for grades 8th-12th and meets the fourth Sunday of each month in the Parish House Youth Room beginning September 26, 2021. More information will come shortly. Information about Confirmation Class is coming - please stay tuned.

We will remain masked up in the classrooms and continue to follow the mandates set forth by the State of Connecticut and the CDC, as well as staying in lockstep with the New Milford Schools as they adjust their guidelines.



Buildings and Grounds

- The decorative stone wall in front of the Parish House nursery, was significantly damaged by a vehicle impact over the last month. No one has come forward nor have we seen a vehicle in our parking lot with telltale damage. Bill Jackson and John Wittmann repaired the wall to near its original appearance as a few of the underlying stones were cracked.
- We installed a new air conditioner in the Parish House office and sealed it inside and out with a surround of Plexiglass.
- Parish House basement dehumidifiers are now draining continuously. One drains into the Youth Room kitchen sink and the other into a containment barrel in the furnace room and then into the in-ground sump. This will minimize the amount of times that the units need attending to. From just four days after the barrel and sump drain was installed, the barrel collected 20 gallons of water! This should not only help with reducing daily maintenance but also help the air quality and overall health of the environment.
- The office has a new and very inviting look thanks to Nicole Henderson, Dawn Kraft, and others.
- The Fellowship Hall floor has been completely refinished and looks in near new condition. Many thanks to our "go-to" company, Crown Maintenance, and owner Serafin (AKA Serf)
- Lambert and Barr has sent us a proposal to replace the storm/screen windows in Amy's office. The current ones are dysfunctional. Funding sources are being researched to accomplish the task before winter weather.
- John Wittmann arranged with the Town of New Milford DPW to chip seal the entire parking lot behind the church, which includes our small section. The date has yet to be determined and notices will have to go out. This will be at no cost to us as the town regularly uses our few spaces. He is also working on having the lines repainted and will update soon. Without this very much needed maintenance our asphalt will not last much longer. This past spring we swept up half of a plastic trash barrel of loose stone from our area alone.
- We received the estimate to install handicap assisted openers on the Fellowship Hall bathroom doors. At \$3,800 we were surprised that it wasn't more. This expenditure will be a discussion for the MRC and others.

We will walk from the church to Big Y, buy a bag of groceries (there will be a suggested list of items to purchase), and walk back to the church with your bag, and deposit in the food bins outside the Parish House. Cookies, water and lemonade will be provided to all walkers outside of the Parish House. *Please bring \$10 to purchase the food*.
